Job purpose

To deliver the strategy set by the Kids Champion to draw families into the Church through the Kerith Kids ministry.

To lead and manage Sundays, mid-week activities and events; inspire others to serve in Kerith Kids and build a strong team to deliver the curricula and programmes.

To support the Kids Champion in delivering the Kerith Kids ministry vision within the church, the staff team, people in the wider community and volunteers.

Main duties

- Promote and safeguard the welfare of all children in Kerith Kids.
- Oversee the site's Sunday programme, ensuring all teams are equipped with the curricula and resources needed. This includes ensuring the curricula translate to the site and resources are prepared.
- Recruit and manage volunteers to assist with mid-week curricula preparation.
- Support the Kids Champion in troubleshooting any ministry issues that arise.
- Support the Kids Champion in organising One Church Kids/Kids' Team events – eg. Christmas Eve Family Meeting.
- Be the 'face' of Kids' work at the Bracknell site – raising the profile of kids' work within the adult church, networking and building relationships – also with parents of Kerith Kids.
- Leading Team prayers on a Sunday morning.
- Being available some Sunday mornings in The Kerith Centre adult meetings, for networking/team recruitment.
- To develop the Kerith Kids Sunday worship experience by partnering with the Worship Pastor.
- Identifying and pastoring a team of core Kids' Team Leaders at the Bracknell site.
- Manage the recruitment of new Kerith Kids volunteers for the Bracknell site working closely with our Safe Recruitment Team.
- Facilitate and coordinate the induction, training and supervision of Kerith Kids' volunteers.
- Facilitate the delivery of the Kerith DNA and culture by regularly gathering the volunteer teams.
- Organise site-specific Kids Team appreciation events and correspondence.
- Organise occasional site-specific Kids' events outside of Sundays, eg. Holiday Club in a day.
